The Bonney Lake Food Bank is embarking on an exciting new chapter as we move to a larger location. This move not only supports the profound increase of our neighbors facing food insecurity, it also solidifies our future sustainability as an organization.

We have a 25-year lease for two buildings and additional multiuse space from Roots Collective off 410. These new spaces add additional capacity for our food pantry, provide office space for our staff and shared services, and allow for space to grow our own food with a community garden.

We are raising \$250,000 for renovations of these buildings and to move into the facility by the end of the year or sooner.

Equity and social justice — Food insecurity must be addressed by providing those in need with equitable access to resources and nutritious food.


Collaboration – We build unity through teamwork with our partners, staff, and supporters.

INNOVATION / EFFICIENCY

We are a forward-thinking organization that has moved from a static organization to one that uses innovative processes to increase our efficiency and effectiveness. These actions will ground us with sustainability and guide us through the much longer road ahead.

Some accomplishments that have made us stronger and more efficient:

- Hired a passionate Executive Director with vision and drive
- Acquired lines of funding to help us replace aging or nonfunctioning equipment
- Shifted our service model on a dime to meet increasing client count
- Began using a texting app to communicate with our clients in 3different languages
- Developed a Strategic Plan and made progress in the objectives
- Harnessed the power of technology to help optimize many facets of our operations
- Developed key partnerships with community stakeholders including our suppliers, other food banks, the school district, and many others
- Strengthened our legal compliance with law firm consultant
- Hired a new accounting firm to ensure compliance with tax law



CRITICAL NEED

CAPACITY:

A larger facility is critical to serving the unprecedented growth of over 70% more people.

UNSAFE BUILDING:

- Our current building in Bonney Lake is less than 800 square feet of usable space for processing over 250,000 lbs of food monthly.
- The 2nd Floor of the building is unusable due to water damage, and the roof is structurally unsound.
- We are also operating out of 11 outdoor construction containers without heat or electricity. In a cramped parking lot, these become hazardous for volunteers and staff.


TEMPORARY PLAN:

The Bonney Lake Food Bank has been here from week 1 to help our community navigate the effects of COVID19. Our growth in food distribution has been profound, but our ability to do so with great dignity has been more profound. We have used grant funding and resource to ensure that no person in our community goes hungry and that they don't experience loss of dignity in the process.

THE MARKET is our solution to this continued growth and serving with dignity. Many of the neighbors we are now supporting have never used this resource before. We want ALL our patrons, especially children, to walk through our doors and not feel the difference between a food bank and a grocery store.

THE FARMHOUSE is our solution in creating a communal hub where we can work TOGETHER to solve some of the complex issues that are impacting our community right now.

The ROOTS COLLECTIVE FARM location is our solution for the room we need to grow and build upon the program foundations we have already forged. Phase 2 of our plans will include a Children's Community Garden, Farm To Fork learning opportunities, and internships for our clients.






